The plan is for the Math coach to return in May. Those receiving coaching will include Kelly Clarke, Principal Registration – A recent poll estimates the number of registrations to be

around 300. At this point, it is anticipated that the number of classrooms will remain the same except for one less pre-primary classroom.

Staffing – There is a direct correlation between staffing and number of registrations. The number of registrations is used to determine the number of teachers required including Physical Education, Music etc. A request has been made for more resource support.

Mi'kmaq presentation – An HRCE employee will be coming to the school and spend a day in the gym. They will be conducting 45 minute presentations (classes will rotate in order to attend a presentation) and will be sharing cultural items used for cultural celebrations.

Provincial Assessments – Gr. 3 – Grade 3 provincial assessments in relation to maths, reading and writing will be conducted over two weeks in May (May 17th and 19th for reading and writing and May 26th and 27th for maths). Typically, results are only shared in the Fall.
